Foreword


We are pleased to publish this quarter's International Merchandise Trade Statistics (IMTS) publication.

Compiled using the United Nation's IMTS Concepts and Definitions 2010, the release provides statistics on exports and imports by commodity and country. The release also includes information on the mode of transport used for the trade of goods.

The classification used is the Palau Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System 2017 (HS17) which is the latest based off the World Custom Organisation's HS17. Exports have been valued on a *free on board* basis and imports have been valued on a *cost, insurance and freight* basis.

OPS hopes that the information provided, amongst the many uses, will help policy makers better plan and negotiate trade deals as well as develop relevant trade policies for Palau, meet the data needs for food security and non-communicable diseases, and other national plans and strategies.

Data used for the compilation have been sourced from the Bureau of Customs and Border Protection. We acknowledge with great appreciation their valuable contribution and we look forward to their continued support.

Explanatory Notes

Balance of trade	<p>Balance of trade of goods is the net sum of exports and imports of goods.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">○ A positive trade balance (surplus) indicates that the value of exports has exceeded the value of imports.○ A negative trade balance (deficit) indicates that the value of imports has exceeded the value of exports.
CIF	<p>Cost, insurance, and freight: includes the transaction value of the goods, insurance, and freight to deliver the goods from the border of the exporting country to the border of the importing country.</p>
FOB	<p>Free on board: includes the transaction value of the goods and the value of services performed to deliver goods to the border of the exporting country.</p>
HS	<p>The Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System: is a classification of exports and imports of goods. The latest version is '2017' and the custodian of it is the World Customs Organisation (WCO). Palau uses the Palau Harmonized System based on the WCOs HS17. For HS Sections and Chapters refer to Appendix 2.</p>

Performance of exports

- In the 2nd quarter of 2022, total exports saw an increase of 945.9 percent (or \$4.2 million) compared to the same period last year.
- Lead export was Fish and crustaceans, molluscs, and other aquatic invertebrates which saw a reduction of 9.7 percent (or \$8.1 thousand).
- Exports by geographical regions showed exports going to Oceania (increased by 382.2 percent), Asia (increased by 29.1 percent), and The Americas (increased by 4,377.9 percent).

Performance of imports

- In the 2nd quarter of 2022, total imports increased by 13.6 percent (or \$5.10 million) over the same period last year. The top five sections that showed significant increases include:
 - Mineral products rose by 92.7 percent (or \$6.7 million)
 - Works of art, collectors pieces & antiques went up by 88.6 percent (or \$1.1 thousand)
 - Animal or vegetable oils & fats thereof went up by 72.9 percent (or \$127.9 thousand)
 - Footwear, headgear, umbrellas & parts thereof increased by 45.4 percent (or \$77.2 thousand)
 - Prepared foodstuffs, beverages, spirits & tobacco increased by 28.2 percent (or \$1.2 million)
- Imports by geographical regions showed imports from Asia (up by 39.1 percent), The Americas (down by 14.1 percent) and Oceania (increased by 29.6 percent).

Trade balance

- The total value of imports (\$42.6 million) exceeded the total value of exports (\$4.6 million) resulting in a trade deficit of \$38 million.

Figure 1. Merchandise Trade Statistics

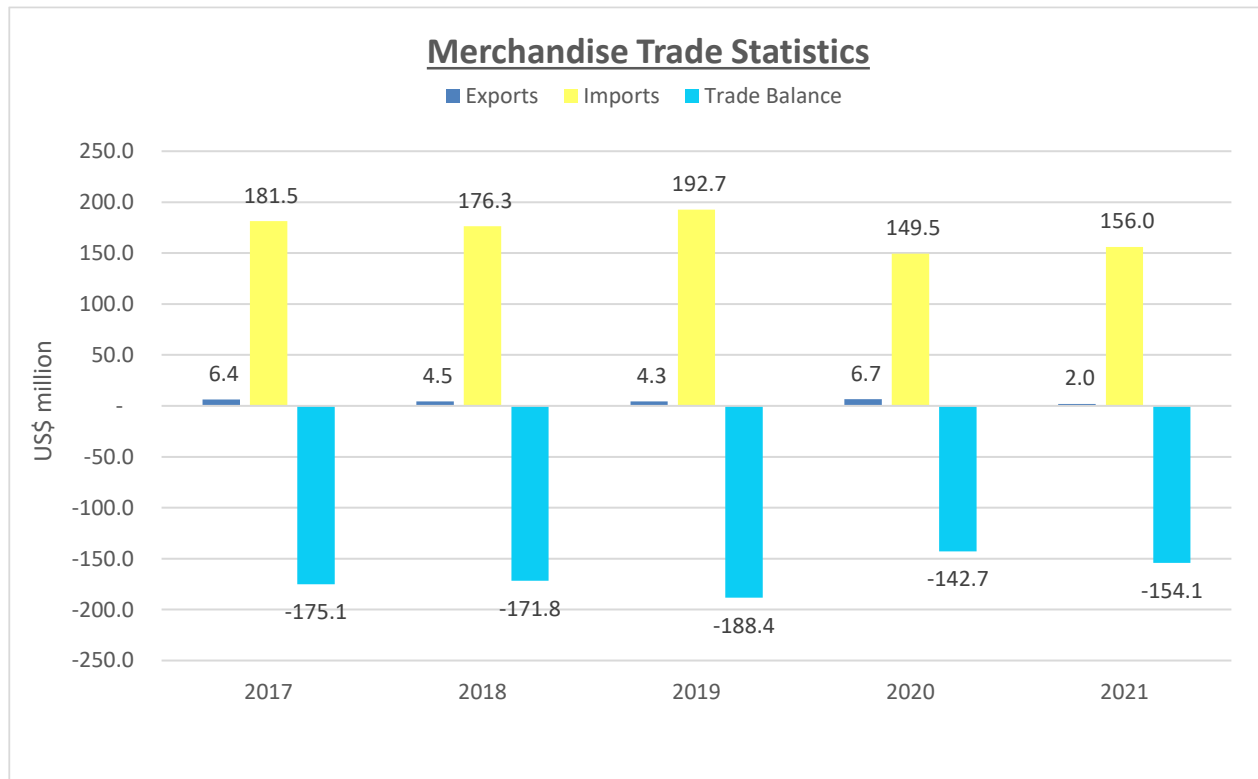
